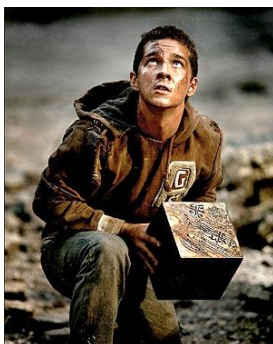


## Star Trek, Transformers 2 and The Proposal: Which One of These is Not Like the Other?
